

#### **Tips for Graphics**


- Use graphics not words


#### Takeaways/Handouts



Logistics



#### Technology

- Know what tech is in the room.
  - > HDMI port or dongle; 16:9 screens
- Encourage the virtual audience to use the chat function.
- Share a tinyurl of your slide deck
- Wireless internet in conference space
- Hallway monitors if there is an AV or tech issue.



#### Room Set-up

- Round tables (primarily) for attendees
- Presenters:
  - Podium + head table for 3
  - Mics (usually, depending on room size; may have to share if multiple presenters)
  - Use mic to repeat any questions asked by audience
  - Upload/link slides/handouts to the conference management system

#### Log into your OLC user account
